Hotel Performance - NI

January-May 2023

Northern Ireland Statistics and Research Agency (NISRA) accommodation statistics for January-May 2023 indicate hotel room occupancy experienced a minor increase while bed occupancy declined marginally compared with the same period pre-pandemic. Year-to-date room sales have decreased in January-May 2023 compared with 2019. Room occupancy for the month of May 2023 grew by 3 percentage points and room sales also declined by 3% compared to May 2019.

Room and Bed Occupancy

- Northern Ireland (NI) year-to-date (YTD) hotel room and bed occupancy figures sit at 62% and 48% respectively. These represent a 1 percentage point increase in room occupancy and a 1 percentage point decline in bed occupancy compared to 2019.
- Looking at individual monthly performance, room occupancy in May 2023 (75%) was up by 3 percentage points compared to May 2019. Room occupancy in May 2023 also increased by 7 percentage points compared to last month (April 2023 – 68% room occupancy).
- NI's 2023 YTD hotel room occupancy is 4 percentage points higher than last year (January-May 2022).

Room and Bed Sales

- Room sales in the month of May 2023 declined by 3% compared to May 2019. We had previously seen monthly increases in room sales in March and April 2023 vs 2019.
- Despite this, YTD room sales remain 4% below January-May 2019. The same figure as reported in last month's report.
- Bed sales in May 2022 also declined by 4%. This followed on from the 17% increase in bed sales reported in April 2023.
- YTD bed sales for January-May 2023 are on par with 2019.
- Compared to last year (2022), January-May 2023 room and bed sales are both 1% below 2022 levels.

Hotel Performance - NI

January-May 2023

Performance during January-May 2023 varied across NI Local Government Districts (LGD). Belfast City recorded the highest room occupancy of all the NI LGDs (71%) and was the only reporting LGD to experience a growth in YTD room occupancy compared to 2019.

Northern Ireland Statistics and Research Agency (NISRA) accommodation statistics for January-May 2023 indicate that guesthouses, guest accommodation and B&Bs (GH/GA/BB) experienced increases in both room occupancy and sales compared to 2019 and 2022 figures. Performance suggests this sector is continuing to progress better in its recovery than hotels.

Room and Bed Occupancy

- Northern Ireland guest houses, guest accommodation and B&Bs (GH/GA/BB) have had a positive January-May 2023 period, with room occupancy experiencing growth of 5 percentage points compared to 2019. Bed occupancy has seen larger growth of 9 percentage points.
- Looking at individual monthly performance, room occupancy in the month of May 2022 experienced growth of 2 percentage points compared to the same month in 2019, marking the fifth consecutive month of growth vs 2019.
- GH/GA/BB room and bed occupancy have increased by 1 percentage point and 4 percentage points respectively in comparison to last month (April 2023)

Room and Bed Sales

- There have been over 185,000 rooms and more than 373,000 bed spaces sold in guest houses, guest accommodation and B&Bs in January-May 2023
- NI GH/GA/BB room sales for January-May 2023 have increased by 23% compared to January-May 2019.
- Looking at individual monthly performance, room sales in May 2023 grew by 10% compared to May 2019. This follows on from increases of 18% in April, 26% in March, 13% in February 2019, and 73% in January 2019.
- Compared to last year (January-May 2022), GH/GA/BB room sales have increased by 5% in 2023.

Room and bed-space occupancy varied across Local Government Districts (LGDs) during January-May 2023. Belfast City LGD recorded the highest room occupancy (51%), while Lisburn & Castlereagh LGD recorded the largest increase in room occupancy compared with January-May 2019 (+14pps).
